HUMILITY AND ETERNITY

Jer. 8:7

7 Yea, the stork in the heaven knoweth her appointed times; and the turtle and the crane and the swallow observe the time of their coming; but my people know not the judgment of the Lord.

- 5 Whoso keepeth the commandment shall feel no evil thing: and a wise man's heart discerneth both time and judgment.

- 5 To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child.
