- ⁶ never produces mind. The immortal never produces the mortal. Good cannot result in evil. As God Himself is good and is Spirit, goodness and spirituality must be im-
- ⁹ mortal. Their opposites, evil and matter, are mortal error, and error has no creator.

The temporal and unreal never touch the eternal and real. The mutable and imperfect never touch the im-

- ¹⁵ mutable and perfect. The inharmonious and self-destructive never touch the harmonious and self-existent. These opposite qualities are the tares
- 18 and wheat, which never really mingle, though (to mortal sight) they grow side by side until the harvest; then, Science separates the wheat from the tares, through the real-
- 21 ization of God as ever present and of man as reflecting the divine likeness.

⁹ If the student goes away to practise Truth's teachings only in part, dividing his interests between God and mammon and substituting his own views for

 $_{\rm 12}\,$ Truth, he will inevitably reap the error he sows.

To be immortal, we must forsake the ³ mortal sense of things, turn from the lie of false belief to Truth, and gather the facts of being from the divine Mind.

- ³ The spiritual sense of truth must be gained before Truth can be understood. This sense is assimilated only as we are honest, unselfish, loving, and meek.
- ⁶ In the soil of an "honest and good heart" the seed must be sown; else it beareth not much fruit, for the swinish element in human nature uproots it.

Science reveals the possibility of achieving all good, and sets mortals at work to discover what God has already

done; but distrust of one's ability to gain the goodness desired and to bring out better and higher results, often hampers the trial of one's wings and ensures failure at the
outset.

The divine Mind, which forms the bud and blossom, will care for the human 24 body, even as it clothes the lily; but let no mortal interfere with God's government by thrusting in the laws of erring, human concepts.

- ¹ Truth, makes all things possible to Spirit; but the socalled laws of matter would render Spirit of no avail, and
- ³ demand obedience to materialistic codes, thus departing from the basis of one God, one lawmaker. To suppose that God constitutes laws of inharmony is a mistake; dis-
- ⁶ cords have no support from nature or divine law, however much is said to the contrary.

Can the agriculturist, according to belief, produce a ⁹ crop without sowing the seed and awaiting its germination according to the laws of nature? The answer is no, and yet the Scriptures inform us that sin, or error, first

- 12 caused the condemnation of man to till the ground, and indicate that obedience to God will remove this necessity. Truth never made error necessary, nor devised a law to
- 15 perpetuate error.

SH 183:19-21

Laws of nature are laws of Spirit; but mortals commonly recognize as law that which hides the power of ²¹ Spirit.

SH 551:27

All must be Mind, orelse all must be matter. Neither can produce the other.Mind is immortal; but error declares that the material

30 seed must decay in order to propagate its species, and the resulting germ is doomed to the same routine.
